

WEST, TEXAS

Hlavní město Čechů ve státě TEXAS je město nazývané WEST

Proč se tak nazývá?

V období mezi léty 1850 a 1860 angloameičtí setleři vytvořili v Texasu malou farmářskou komunitu, kterou nazvali BOLD SPRINGS.

Hlavním faktorem při zformování této entity byla výstavba železnice Missouri - Kansas - Texas v roce 1880.

Významný obchodník na tomto místě Thomas M. West vlastnil bezpečnou oblast v tu dobu a přesvědčil i své sousedy, aby si tyto perspektivní pozemky drželi. Měl vynikající pověst a s tím související respekt. Město se pojmenovalo po něm. Zprvu jako "WEST STATION", později "WEST".

Za růstem města stála další železnice mezi městy WACO a DALLAS v roce 1913 včetně napojení na důležitá centra SAN ANTONIO a AUSTIN směrem na FORT WORTH a DALLAS.

Obchodní klub byl založen v roce 1922 a pak Obchodní komora v roce 1926. Novému byznysu nic nestálo v cestě.

Od roku 1976 se konají ve městě West slavnosti WESTFEST. Město je proslaveno vynikajícími koláči (kolaches). Do dneška lze měste narazit na česká příjmení - Polansky, Krizan, Nemecek a na další s českým původem. Do angličtiny v této oblasti se dostala i jména z češtiny - kolache (s), krojs a další.

Two bands, JDC and The Monticorns, will be the featured performers at the Preview Party Friday night. Many of the concessions and booths will be open. One of the most unusual parades you've ever seen kicks off the weekend at 10:00 Saturday morning.

Other events to check out include a Polka Mass, the Kolache Baking Contest, the Kolache 5000+ Race, Volleyball Tournament, Horseshoe Pitching and Tackety Tournament. The Arts and Crafts area features over 90 artists and crafts people. There is plenty of fun in store for the kids at Westfest. Performing clowns, games, carnival rides and special "hands-on" exhibits in the cultural area

will keep them busy. Also in the Cultural Demonstration area, local heritage volunteers show you how our ancestors made sausage, baked kolaches, and performed various jobs unique to Czech culture and the early settlers of West.

Down the food aisles you can find sausage served in every way possible. Seuerkraut potato pancakes, and of course kolaches are only a few of the treats available.

The new Cultural Amphitheater features a big selection of ethnic entertainment. Enjoy watching the many dance groups perform in their beautiful costumes. Sokol Gymnastics is also presented in this area.

Visit the dance tents where polka bands play continuously and you can dance to your heart's content. There are two large dance areas with plenty of tables and chairs for your comfort.
